A Bitter Root Produces Sour Fruit

When a person becomes offended and doesn't deal with that offence correctly, that bitterness often churns so long in a person's soul that it turns into a root of bitterness. This is exactly what Hebrews 12:15 is talking about when it says, 'Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God, lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled'.



The word 'root' is the Greek word *ridzo*. It refers to a root like the root of a tree. These are roots that have grown down deep and are now deeply embedded. Therefore, the word 'ridzo' often denotes something that is established or firmly fixed.



By using the word 'ridzo' (root), God is telling you that if you don't repent of bitterness and remove it from your life, it becomes deeply embedded in your soul. Once it becomes this deeply rooted in your soul, your negative opinion of the offender will become firmly fixed. As time passes, your thoughts of judgment against the person will become more developed, rationalised and established. That root of bitterness will become so firmly fixed inside you that your angry judgmental thoughts about the person will actually begin to make sense to you.

When a 'root of bitterness' gets this deeply embedded in your mind and emotions, it is no longer just a 'root' you are dealing with; now you have a mental stronghold.

The account could not be opened until I had sent all the documents back to the branch, signed by both myself and my mother. I had prepared everything, only to place it in a draw and completely forget it about it.

A week later we received through the post 2 credit cards from the bank for the business account. We were very excited to find that now we could buy the tickets.

But that is when I found the envelope with all the documentation for the opening of the account still sitting in my draw.

All I could think was, 'How can a bank open a business account with no signed documentation? And not only that, how could they send 2 credit cards in the exact amounts we needed to buy those tickets?'

Well I'll tell you how... God does it! He doesn't need papers or to follow procedures; all He needs is our unconditional faith and prayers.
